Father Rockers grew up in Hays, Ks and graduated from Hays High School in 2003. He attended Kansas State University then transferred to Fort Hays State University where he graduated in 2007. Father went to seminary at Kenrick-Glennon Seminary in St. Louis, MO and was ordained in 2015.

Following ordination, Father Rockers served as parochial vicar at Sacred Heart Cathedral and as chaplain at Sacred Heart Junior/Senior High School, Salina. He then served as parochial vicar and then pastor in Goodland and Sharon Springs for a total of three years. He returned to Salina in 2020 serving at the Cathedral and teaching senior religion at Sacred Heart Junior/Senior High School.

Father's parents continue to reside in Hays, and he has one older brother who lives in New York.

Father Rockers moved to Beloit in August and has jumped right in. He serves as Parochial Vicar at St. John's and Sts. Peter and Paul in Cawker City and teaches Spanish, Latin, and Catholic Culture and History at St. John's High School.

I am Fr. Jarett Konrade. I have been the pastor here at St. John's since July 2020 and been a priest of the Diocese of Salina since 2005. During those years I have served in Salina, Wilson, Manhattan, Hays and Director of Priestly Vocations for 6 years. During the year that I have served in Beloit, I have come to see some of the challenges that continue to divide our community, but overwhelmingly I see the immense possibilities for an amazing future.

Since being assigned to St. John's, I have attended each of the Cornerstone Charitable Foundation board meetings. I have come to know each of the board members, have met their families and have witnessed how they strive to put into action their faith in the Catholic community and beyond. I am very grateful for the role this board has played in the development of St. John's Parish and school over the years. I have found them to be supportive, faithful and trustworthy and I fully approve and appreciate their continued assistance of St. John the Baptist Parish and school for the future.

Why am I writing this letter? . . . You may or may not be aware of the strained relationship between Cornerstone and the Diocese of Salina from 2012 to 2018. It reached the point where Cornerstone was restricted from using the name or image of St. John's in its fundraising endeavors to name just one of the challenges of that period. We are excited to announce, that chapter is behind us. After meeting multiple times with Bishop Vincke and other representatives of the Diocese, the Bishop has issued a letter supporting, encouraging, and reinstating Cornerstone in its role within the St. John's Parish and school. This letter has also been read and affirmed by the St. John's Parish and Finance councils. Should you wish to view this letter, it is posted on our parish website (www.stjohnsbeloit.org). To quote one line from the Bishop's letter, "They have done

remarkable service for the parish and school."



Finally, most of you know of the recent fire that took place at St John's. More than likely, fond, unique and sacred memories are your recollections of our wonderful church. I am using the school newsletter, a newsletter that has been 100% quietly funded and coordinated now for many years by Cornerstone, to ask for your assistance with some of the church repairs.



Currently, we have a group of parish individuals diligently and prudently working to make the most out of this situation. Regardless of the insurance proceeds, the parish will bear significant out-of-pocket costs. We anticipate those costs could be well deep into six figures. For this reason, we are asking for your support. Improvements

When visiting St. John's Catholic High School, keep an eye out for school improvements and repairs carried out over the summer. The high school building has updated its security system. All school staff now have key fobs to facilitate their access. The high school has received 30 new Chromebooks, as well as new History books. Chemistry, Physics, and Biology have received new lab materials and there are new whiteboards in the Science room. Finally, the gymnasium has had a new mic system installed.

The St. John's Grade School has also had its fair share of renovations. The power lines and gas meters on the playground have been buried. These are the last remnants of the landscape improvements initiated in the Spring of 2020 by Cornerstone. The grade school also got new whiteboards, desks, and 30 new Chromebooks. Make sure to check out the grade school basement, updated by Geoff Jermark. The grade school and high school buildings have been upgraded to LED lighting, thanks to Jason Carr.

The St. John's school grounds have also had improvements done. Mike Blass laid the concrete in front of the high school as well as donating doors and his time to the high school. Dean Gengler and his crew improved the powerhouse and Jesse Mudd treated the stickers on the practice field. Clint Horinek has been mowing all of the St. John's grounds.
